We then witnessed the laying of the ILOH wreath placed on the stand next to the Tomb. After this we went across the street to the Tomb Canadian and placed poppies on the monument. I was fortunate to see Audie Murphy's grave which was close by.

We returned to the hotel, changed clothes and enjoyed a Thanksgiving dinner before leaving for the airport. 


it and bring it home to Florida with them. That's the good news as the Noble who brought it back lives in Northern Florida and was willing to meet me half way to give me my fez case.


Dapper Dan Says "Circus, Circus, Circus."



"He is a member of the Saw Dust Engineers and has been working on carving a Green-Winged Teal Drake duck under the instruction of Bill Anderson. The duck took 13 months to complete. It is absolutely beautiful. Larry has also carved a beautiful Carolina Wren. Larry also worked on a relief carving of a Maple Leaf. The Maple Leaf will be exhibited soon in the Punta Gorda Wood Carving Show.

When Larry first

joined the Saw Dust

Engineers, he met Bill and was asked if he would like to carve a buffalo head. That was his first project. It is a beautiful piece of art.

Larry was born and raised in Saugis, New



England. Larry comes from a lineage of boat builders. His Grandfather and Father built boats. Prior to moving to Sun City Center, Larry built his own 8' boat which was the start of his hobby working with wood. Larry married his high school sweetheart. Marjorie in 1962. Together they had 2 children; a son, David 54, and daughter, Kimberly 51.

Larry served our

country in the army and National Guard. He was the Communications Chief. He was in the 101st Engineer Batallion of the National Guard which has a proud heritage of 350 years of service. Larry has been a Shriner since 1986. He had a friend who was a Shriner clown from Chicago. His friend kept inviting him to go to Shrine Events and Larry started meeting people and became a Mason. He belonged to Shrine Clubs in Arizona and Washington State. He joined the Sun City Center Shrine Club in 2016.

He has provided great

Banner. Whenever

The Wing family home, built in 1641, in Sandwich, Massachusetts is the oldest US home still owed by the same family. It was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1976.

Tradition states the home was at one time a fort to protect the earliest settlers from the Native

Americans. However, the Cape Indians were found to be friendly and there was no need for any protection.

The Wing home is now a museum, privately operated by the Wing Family of America, Inc. Larry joined the Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 75 in Apollo Beach, FL. He is an amateur radio operator for 100W transceiver VHF radio. The Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla is a voluntary position with an emphasis on Safety on behalf of the Coast Guard. The Auxiliary has no legal control but again, focuses to educate others on safety.

The Shriners Hospitals for Children Open is a golf tournament on the PGA Tour in Nevada. Founded 36 years ago, in 1983, it is the fourth event of the Tour's 2019-20 wrap-

around season and is played annually in October in Las Vegas. When created in 1983, it had the highest purse on tour at \$750,000. In 2007 the tournament announced that the Shriners Hospitals for Children would take over the operations of the tournament, and that the Las Vegas Founders, a volunteer group, would no longer be involved with the event.

In its history, the
Las Vegas event has been
hosted by numerous
courses before settling at
its current venue, TPC
Summerlin.






