## The President's Message



OUR PANCAKE BRUNCHES ARE ON LIFE SUPPORT. Only a handful of Nobles participated in our Spring Pancake Brunch. On the Friday and Saturday of street sales, we never had enough Nobles at Wal Mart to cover all three entrances. At Winn Dixie and Publix, entire shifts went uncovered due to no-shows on the part of Nobles that had volunteered. Add up all the hours that went uncovered and you see a significant loss of income.

On Saturday before the brunch, only five of us showed up to prepare the venue. Outside a lady named Jean Wadlin was looking for a relative's brick in the Veteran's Memorial. Curiosity led her to look inside the hall and she noticed that the Shriners' whom she admires, were setting up, so she went in and offered to help. She stayed

with us the entire time we were setting up the dining room and helped non-stop. She has no personal connections to Masons or Shriners, she just cared and wanted to see the brunch be successful.

On Sunday there was a line of people waiting for us to open and start the brunch. We had a few SCC Shrine Nobles and Ladies, some volunteers from DeMolay chapters, The Divan, Showmen's Club and DeSoto Lodge, but not near enough. Ushers were hard to find, customers requests for coffee and "seconds" were going ignored. The handicap area was unattended, and seating there was a challenge. The few volunteers we had were doing the best they could but could not keep up and we were forced to ask for volunteers from the audience. Thanks to the kindness of guests we salvaged the event, but not with the excellence we expect of ourselves, and with the few workers we had being utterly exhausted.

This apathy makes me sad, and if you love the Shrine and our club, it should make you sad too. I am not questioning long time brunch contributors. Some have gotten up in age, could be mobility challenged, or just tired of carrying the load year after year. This apathy has been called to the Nobility's attention before, but cooperation does not improve. As of this moment, I see no way we can do any more pancake brunches. We don't have enough volunteers. We don't have enough Nobles that care.

As a last ditch effort, I have appointed a committee chaired by Past President Gene Welper, that incudes Past President Don Churchill and First Vice President Jim Porrett. They have been asked to study the situation and try to make recommendations by which to rescue the brunches or perhaps try other revenue generating incentives. I will keep you posted on their recommendations. Our club that once boasted of hundreds of members now has around 100, and only a few that genuinely care. Can our brunches survive? For that matter, can our club survive?


